Words from the Chef

I was curious about cutting boards this week. It feels like they're an afterthought in the kitchen. Thinking about a nice wood cutting board to serve charcuterie or crudite and how the grain can really amplify the dish. Plastic cutting boards are great because they are cheap and easy to color coordinate for fish, chicken, beef, veg.

It got me thinking, which one is better for home use. Wooden boards are heavy and scratch marks can show up pretty easily and require more effort to clean properly. Plastic boards normally have rubber feet and don't slide around but collect bacteria that's harder to get rid of without doing a bleach soak. This week I found a cool wooden board with rubber feet. The beautiful mix of walnut and oak colors was really appealing and I know that with a simple vinegar and baking soda I can clean and kill any excess bacteria making it a safer tool. I didn't buy it even though I wanted to. At the end of the day I guess it's whatever is most convenient for your needs.

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
